Good evening all,

Thank you for taking your time to attend the Centre's 2021 AGM.

My name is Patrick Vaiano, and I am the elected Treasurer of the Centre.

I would like to thank the committee for their support and assistance during the year and wish all the best for those committee members to whom will not be returning.

A special thank you to all committee members whom under testing times during Covid-19 restrictions, managed to arrange and eventually organise the limited Centre activities. You should all be very proud of your efforts.

On behalf of the Centre's Committee of Management, we present the audited financial statements for the year ended 28 February 2021.

We confirm that the Centre has provided a net operating profit of \$13,493 for the year ended 28 February 2021 in comparison to a \$23,219 profit in the 2020 financial year. A reduction of \$9,726 due to the Centre not being able to operate through out the 2021 financial year due Covid-19 restrictions.

The net profit was attributable by the total income generated by the Centre including the Canteen proceeds which amounted to \$109,293; less total expenditure of \$95,800.

In relation to the Centre's Statement of Financial Position, the Balance Sheet, we confirm the following: -

Total Assets = \$176,862 made up of

Current Assets - \$142,816 manly the Centre's Cash at bank, Trade Debtors & Stock on Hand;

Non-Current Assets - \$34,046 Centre's Track Equipment;

Less Total Liabilities = \$3,976 Trade Creditors, ATO GST & Payroll Liabilities.

Net Assets = \$172.886.

The Centre is in a healthy financial shape. However, we do note that currently, even though the Centre has been displaced in providing athletic events to the community, the Centre has been able to maintain a healthy financial position due to the Centre being able to qualify for both Federal and State Government Grants that have been made available to date.

This will provide the Centre to be able to allocate some capital expenditure on club equipment and particularly the upgrade of computer equipment, internet and IT infrastructure.

This will provide the opportunity to consolidate a strong balance sheet going forward, but we will still need to be to be vigilant with budgeting and cash flow monitoring, including all internal processing standards.

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Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 28 February 2021

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. In the opinion of the committee the association is not a reporting entity because it is not reasonable to expect the existence of users who rely on the association's general purpose financial statements for information useful to them for making and evaluating decisions about the allocation of resources.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the Associations Incorporations Act, the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements, AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors, AASB 1031: Materiality and AASB 1054: Australian Additional Disclosures.

The association has concluded that the requirements set out in AASB 10 and AASB 128 are not applicable as the initial assessment on its interests in other entities indicated that it does not have any subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures. Hence, the financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The association has not assessed whether these special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

(b) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

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Independent Auditor's Report

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of DONCASTER LITTLE ATHLETICS CENTRE INC, which comprises the Statement by Members of the Committee, Income and Expenditure Statement, Balance Sheet, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes for the financial year ended 28 February 2021.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The committee of DONCASTER LITTLE ATHLETICS CENTRE INC are responsible for the preparation of the financial report and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The committee's responsibilities also includes such internal control as the committee determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Those Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view, in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Qualification

Due to the nature of the Centre's activities we have been unable to conduct the following normal audit procedures.

- (i) It was not practicable to positively confirm all takings from the income producing activities conducted by the Centre during the year beyond accounting for amounts shown as received by the books and records of the Association.
- (ii) It was not possible to verify all the payments for the year as not all the vouchers could be produced upon request.

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Doncaster LAC Registrar's Report - Season 2020/21

MEMBERSHIPS

DLAC's 2020/2021 season commenced with so many unknowns due to the impact of Covid-19 which had brought the previous season to a premature halt. There were a number of executive meetings held, trying to construct a season of events around many conditions and constraints, including:

- When could we commence season events? How do we advertise when we don't know when we will start, and what we will be allowed to do?
- · Would we be able to hold training sessions?
- Would we be able to cater for all participants at the venue, or would we need to break the meets into small groups?
- Would we have enough support to run the events, and how would we meet the directives on protecting our participants during a pandemic?
- Would parents be permitted to watch their children enjoy their sport?
- How do we provide value for money, especially for the participants who missed out on their full season the previous year? Where do we set our pricing?
- What service do we have to promote to our little athletes to have them join us?

Preparing for an upcoming season has never required such planning, with so many "what if" scenarios to consider. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of all the Executive Committee working behind the scenes to provide your children with the opportunity to "run jump and play"... to learn, grow and compete in the events that they love to do.

On Sunday 25th October, the Victorian Government announced that non-contact sport would be permitted in metropolitan Melbourne effective from the following Tuesday. This was the first confirmation the DLAC Executive had received that we would in fact be able to go ahead with our season calendar. We then had to receive confirmation on the protocols for the safe conduct of community sport from Manningham Council, Little Athletics Victoria (LAVic) and the department of Sport and Recreation Victoria (SRV). After we had these, we were able to confirm our season calendar, post our membership fees and notify eligible participants that we intended to hold our first event a mere two weeks later, on Saturday 14th November 2020.

In other years, we would allow for a small increase in fees to allow for the cost of inflation, however your DLAC Executive were mindful of the effects the pandemic had placed on families. DLAC instead negotiated for a 15% fee reduction for all returning DLAC members. LAVic had not received this request from any other centre, so this caused a delay in being able to open our registration portal to accept any members to the club. They had to find a way to allow this to happen (as LAVic receives all membership fees state-wide and then passes on a portion of fees to the centres) and this further prevented DLAC from being able to promote the coming season and accept registrations.

With 7 days before the opening event, and with **NO** advertising through YourChild Manningham, *or* at local shopping centres *or* to the surrounding primary schools, we nevertheless opened the membership portal to accepting participants for our 2020/21 season. All we had to rely upon to promote the club was our returning members and the referral through word of mouth from the Committee and the past and present members. We weren't sure if the pandemic would shut us down at any moment. We made the decision to forgo the Open Day and fireworks on the weekend before we break for Christmas because we could not be certain that the event would be permitted to proceed. Our future looked so uncertain.

The registration portal opened on 9th November, several days after surrounding centres. By 11.15pm that evening, DLAC had 90 members. On the morning of 14th November, our first scheduled meet of the season, we had 134 financial members. Thank you so much to all our families who believed in us, and supported us and promoted us and signed up and came along to Doncaster to see their children compete!!

Season 2020/21 realised 216 financial members. The previous season of 2019/20, DLAC finished with 267 registered financial members, so numbers were only 51 less than the previous year. Thank you for your support. You came and helped make each week's events happen. You supervised and supported your children, and you worked under the crazy covid-safe conditions that were imposed upon us to allow the events to happen. You were patient and tolerant and every time I spoke to people, you told me you were having some fun despite the tough times. Thank you.

Throughout the 2020/21 season, we had consistent attendance rates of 75% every week and were able to provide 13 full programs of events over the track and field season. The club has battled through the year and the members have helped make it a success.

Our family numbers are dwindling, which makes it more difficult to spread out tasks and duties at the events.



COMPETITION DIRECTORS REPORT SEASON 2020/21

For the second time in two years, I am writing this report during a Covid-19 lockdown, with all community sport currently on hold. Given the uncertainty, we were fortunate to have a summer season this year, with most traditional events held, including our club championships, handicap night and state track and field championships which were cancelled the previous season.

Unfortunately we missed out on the early October start of the season, Doncaster Open Day, Four Pillars Multi, Region Relays and most other centre Open Days.

A lot of work was put into the Covid-safe protocols, including separation of age-groups, socially distancing in the infield, socially distancing in the stand, hand sanitiser, wipes, canteen and clubroom closure, QR codes for entry and changing schedules. This meant that the season looked very different in the early weeks of the season and normality never fully resumed.

Notwithstanding the less than satisfactory start, we finished on a high with our inaugural colour run and presentation night to recognise the efforts of all in a challenging year. Congratulations to all our athletes and families on getting through another summer season of Little Athletics.

We run weekly programs with the assistance of many parent volunteers, at centre level and regional championships. Thanks to each and every person that has contributed to running competition days throughout the season. There are many roles that have been filled and it would be a very long list to thank everyone individually. This year was especially challenging with covid protocols, but we made it through.

Our duty managers at each club filled the rosters to allow the weekly programs to be manned and most weeks we finished in a timely manner. Walks were back into the centre program on a full time basis with the McLennan and Kuppler families offering their expertise.

This coming season will present challenges in terms of event programming and calendars, with the likely retention of check ins, social distancing and sanitising etc. There is also track resurfacing on the horizon which may impact upon the coming season. Please email me if you have any ideas to help improve our program. I am always happy to take on board any comments to help our program run better.

Our On Track (U6 & U7) program was overseen by Jessica Ng and several young coaches from DLAC and DAC. The U6 & U7 athletes had a great year – learning lots of new skills whilst having great fun with their friends. We continued with more competition for On Trackers in the second half of the season in the lead up to the Centre Championships and Handicap.

The continual improvement of our athletes, across all age groups, was evident by the number of PB's generated during weekly competitions. Kids all grow and learn at different rates, so it was especially pleasing to see some of our athletes that were not highly ranked in previous seasons emerging and performing well at centre, region and state competitions this year. The variation in performance between seasons can be enormous – some kids plateau and others take quantum leaps.

Our relay squads provided an opportunity for all athletes, regardless of ability and experience to form part of a team. We visited Box Hill Open Day in February but subsequently the Eastern Metro Relay Championships at Ringwood were cancelled due to the rescheduling of the Track and Field Regionals. This meant that an alternative direct entry State Championship was programmed in late March with timed finals and limited events (4x100m only). Some of our better medal chances were in the medley relays and 4x200m so there were a number of disappointed potential competitors. Unfortunately only one age group was allowed in the venue at a time, and with limited spectators there was no wider Doncaster team assembled over the weekend.

Notwithstanding this, some outstanding results were achieved at the State Championships at Casey, with medals being won as follows:
